Fixing of Scoop

Supply of Scoop in two parts

Scoop is welded out of the factory so that top and bottom cannot be separated. Only the self-watering part can be taken up – it may be secured by three screws. Make sure the bottom plug in the bottom is screwed firmly into Scoop when it is used indoor.

We recommend that you change the bottom plug every two years when Scoop is used indoor, to ensure that the gasket remains tight.



Scoop intended for planting of trees and bushes

Scoop is exclusively intended for planting of trees and bushes, and not for bathing or swimming. Worst-case scenario, if using Scoop as a bathtub, could be drowning.



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Fixing of Scoop in urban space with screws

1 Take out the bottom plug, if you want the water to run out. Use key.



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4 Clean bushings from drill dust so that rubber packings will tigthen smoothly. Fix Scoop to the surface with screws starting from the inside of Scoop into the pre-drilled holes in the cover.

5 Then place the self-watering part and fix it with three screws.



These directions for fixing of Scoop in public domain are only instructive. Storm Design will not guarantee for any theft of or vandalism on Scoop.

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Fixing of Scoop in urban space with fittings

1. Mark in the holes and pre-drill (drill diameter 6 mm). Fix with enclosed screw in firm surface (see also Fixing of Scoop in urban space with screws). This method is recommended by Storm Design.
 Or: 2. Mark in the holes and pre-drill. Fix with expansion bolts. (The expansion bolt is only for fixing in concrete and is not enclosed).

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Fixing of Scoop in urban space with fittings

2 Cast concrete foot with three threaded bars (threaded bar diameter 8 mm). Fix the first bolt and the washer. Fittings and washer and the second bolt. Adjust bolts until Scoop is level.





Mounting of castors on Scoop with fittings

- 1 Place Scoop upside down on for instance the wrapping.
- 2 Turn the enclosed threaded bolt up through the fitting up into the bushing in Scoop.

2 Push the castor up into the threaded bolt, until it says click.

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Fixing of tree to Scoop

- 1 Fix steel wire through the holes at the bottom of the selfwatering part.
- 2 Screw screws from the self-watering part into Scoop's upper part as shown (see also fixing)
- Put some soil and maybe leca pellets in the bottom of the self-watering part and put the tree down on top of it. Fix a too tight around the trunk, as this will stunt the growth of the tree.

4 Pull steel wire through the webbing and twist the wire several times around itself, until it seems quite firm. Cover webbing and steel wire with soil.

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Scoop water – rain water

1 Scoop contains 30 litres of water when the water reaches the bottom of the self-watering part. Plants will drown, if they stand in water for a long time. Therefore, the water level should now and then be measured with a water gauge (to be ordered separately).

Water level in Scoop when

30 litres (bottom) 10 cm

holding: 10 litres

Vacuum Scoop with water vacuum cleaner through the tube for the water gauge, if the water level is too high. Alternatively, drill a little hole approx. 7-10 cm up the side (drill diameter 5), if you do not want to water vacuum (NB! Only if Scoop is placed outside).

2 If it rains 20 mm, there will be approx. 8.8 litres of water in Scoop.

If it rains 70 mm, there will be approx. 30.1 litres of water in Scoop, corresponding to the bottom of the self-watering part. The calculation does not take into account the water that the tree absorbs or displaces.

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Water Gauge

 On receipt of the water gauge: Mark with a waterproof marker:

 15 mm mark shows that the dipstick stands at the bottom of Scoop.
 95 mm mark shows, when the water level reaches the bottom of the selfwatering part.
 It is recommended to measure the water level regularly.

Cleaning instructions

- **1** Use high-pressure cleaner in combination with a soft sponge on very dirty aeras(not at the same time).
- 2 Rubber and Plastic Cleanser the same as is used for cars). Spray onto Scoop when dry and whipe off with a soft cloth. The cleanser removes stains and gives a fresh and new surface but is seldom nessesary. Or: Use basic detergent, a soft sponge and hot water. However, the above-mentioned is better.



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
